If you want to change the folder where your images are uploaded, tap the "Choose a different folder" button or select one of the default options. Otherwise, tap "Upload".Upload Multiple Files Using the File App If you don't mind the extra complexity, using the built-in File app is the best way to manage any cloud service, as it gives you the closest thing to a macOS Finder window you'll find on an iPhone or iPad. This makes it perfect for uploading multiple files to Dropbox. To get started, open the File app and choose the location of the files you want to upload to Dropbox. Press "Select" to start the file selection process. Tap the files you want to upload to Dropbox, then tap the "Move" button. It looks like a folder, and we've highlighted it below. Note: The word "move" replaces this icon on the iPad. Tap "Dropbox" and once the subfolders have appeared, select the destination where you want to upload the files. Finally, tap "Copy."
