Indoor indoor courts Some tennis courts are in the house, which allows you to play regardless of weather conditions and is more comfortable for spectators. Several court surfaces were used in the house. Hard shorts are more common indoors, as they are built on an asphalt or concrete base, as with outdoor courts. Provisional internal courts are typically built using acrylic-seasoned wooden floor panels that are installed on the standard floor of the seat. This is the system used for modern indoor professional events such as ATP Finals. Clay courts can be installed indoors with substructure watering systems to keep the clay from drying out, and have been used for Davis Cup games. Carpet courts were once the most important of the interior surfaces, especially in temporary locations, but have been largely replaced by rigid removable courts. They have been used on both the ATP World Tour and the World Championship and the indoor world championship professional championships in London. The conclusion of the Wimbledon Championships, in 2012, was held on the lawn of the center field under the closed roof and fireworks; The Halle Open also saw a number of games played on its grass field in the Gerry Weber Stadion with the roof closed. These, however, are outdoor locations with retractable roofs.
