The following six beliefs are those that are commonly held by Muslims, as laid out in the Quran and Hadith. Belief in the Oneness of God: Muslims believe that God is the creator of all things, and that God is all-powerful and all-knowing. God has no offspring, no race, no gender, no body, and is unaffected by the characteristics of human life. Belief in the Angels of God: Muslims believe in angels, unseen beings who worship God and carry out God's orders throughout the universe. The angel Gabriel brought the divine revelation to the prophets. Belief in the Books of God: Muslims believe that God revealed holy books or scriptures to a number of God's messengers. These include the Quran (given to Muhammad), the Torah (given to Moses), the Gospel (given to Jesus), the Psalms (given to David), and the Scrolls (given to Abraham). Muslims believe that these earlier scriptures in their original form were divinely revealed, but that only the Quran remains as it was first revealed to the prophet Muhammad. Belief in the Prophets or Messengers of God: Muslims believe that God's guidance has been revealed to humankind through specially appointed messengers, or prophets, throughout history, beginning with the first man, Adam, who is considered the first prophet. Twenty-five of these prophets are mentioned by name in the Quran, including Noah, Abraham, Moses, and Jesus. Muslims believe that Muhammad is the last in this line of prophets, sent for all humankind with the message of Islam. Belief in the Day of Judgment: Muslims believe that on the Day of Judgment, humans will be judged for their actions in this life; those who followed God's guidance will be rewarded with paradise; those who rejected God's guidance will be punished with hell. Belief in the Divine Decree: This article of faith addresses the question of God's will. It can be expressed as the belief that everything is governed by divine decree, namely that whatever happens in one's life is preordained, and that believers should respond to the good or bad that befalls them with thankfulness or patience. This concept does not negate the concept of "free will," since humans do not have prior knowledge of God's decree; they do have freedom of choice. Islam means "submission to God". Muslims believe in one God, Allah, and follow the teachings of the Prophet Muhammad, Allah's messenger. Muhammad received the Qur'an, the Islamic holy book, from Allah. I recollect memories of my early childhood when religious sessions (katha) were held at my parental house. It used to be like festival for us. The priest and other participants in traditional clothing always fascinated me. The shlokas and mantras uttered by the priest, and words written in those scriptures always appeared alien to me. However, the stories, follow-up explanations given by the priest always filled me with a sense of praise - they sounded so convincing and useful for a satisfied life. But the most important thing I remember, as a child, was prasadam - it still leave my mouth watery as I write about it. I also loved the aroma of camphor and incense stick that permeated through the house. Most of the present day kids are not exposed to such environment. Now I understand the importance of the sacred texts. The world 'religion' has different meanings ranging from 'system of faith and worship' to a broader one 'collection of culture, belief and moral values'. I view it as a synonym to humanity. Most of the religions can be associated either to a single scripture or a collection of it. I would like YOU to take a final call on what constitute 'religious book(s)' in your case. For those who believe that religious texts majorly contain ways of worshipping God will be surprised to know they are also a rich source of information about our cultural heritage and traditions. We come across many comic books (Amar Chitra Katha), novels, TV serials, movies that have been inspired by them. The value education subjects taught in the schools or the moral values which we try to build in our children are in some way derived from these religious books. Here, I would like to raise an important issue that why should utilization of religious books be restricted to the interpretation by their followers and preachers alone. Qur'an teaches to all mankind about belief, prayer, and good deeds. Bible can extend support when you are in doubt, lost, mourning, sad, or hopeless. Guru Granth Sahib shows way to attain universal equality. You can add specialised teachings of other religions to this list. Reading of religious books can enhance spiritual and cultural values in children. These texts can guide them about what the aim of life should be and change their outlook on life. I would recommend for exposure of kids to religious books from early childhood, both at home and classroom. If language is a constraint, we may bank upon popular translated versions.
